Notes from previous meeting approved with addition that Jodi attended the site trip to the Water District property.

Water District Property

Tom, Florence and Jodi reported that the property is really green space and it wouldn't be appropriate for active space. However, the commission would like the Mayor to contact Seattle Public Utilities to determine their intentions for the property. If Seattle is willing to divest itself of the property, we can explore this further with Neil Jensen, city engineer.

Eagle Scout Park

Eagle Scout Park was identified as a potential playground for toddlers. There is nothing except for Horizon for this age group. The park would need to be fenced on all sides and there needs to be a stop sign on 178th. Tom Kellogg will pursue the stop sign with Frank Zenk.

We need to determine the need for such a playground. One idea is to get the school's projected census for future Kindergarten kids.

Florence and Tema will meet with Site Line representative, contractor for Horizon View playground to determine if a playground at that site is feasible.

Lake Forest Park Tennis Courts

Tim will draft a letter on behalf of the commission in support of retaining the fully recommended budget sum for tennis court repairs and lighting.

Selection of a chair

Commissioners unanimously voted that commissions and not the Mayor should be able to choose the commission chair.

Arbor Day Award Ceremony

Florence agreed to represent the Parks and Recreation Commission on the planning committee
